

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) Manual Updates

The Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) Manual has been updated by the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH). Key changes include:

- 1. Expanded Definition of Qualified Health Care Professionals (QHCP):
 - Pediatricians can now use the <u>Modified Checklist for Autism in Toddlers</u>, <u>Revised</u> MCHAT-R/F and their clinical judgment to diagnose autism and complete comprehensive diagnostic evaluations.
 - For children with a high-risk score (≥8) on the MCHAT-R/F, pediatricians can independently diagnose autism if their clinical judgment concurs.
 - For children with a moderate risk score (3-7), pediatricians can conduct the MCHAT-R/F follow-up interview and either diagnose autism independently or refer to a subspecialist listed in the ABA Manual.
- 2. Coordination of Care Requirements:
 - The primary care provider's (PCP) name and contact information must be included on all behavior treatment plans.
 - PCPs must be copied on all behavior treatment plans, which can be facilitated through electronic health records.

These updates are reflected in the ABA Manual, available online <u>here</u>. UnitedHealthcare Community Plan will update their systems within 30 days of this.
