Primary Care for Youth and Adults with IDD

This series aims to improve provider knowledge and willingness to care for youth and adults with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD) by hosting a Project ECHO® videoconferencing program to educate clinicians (physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, social workers, and nurses) on the care needs of adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This ECHO series will offer 6 one-hour sessions every other month. Sessions will include a 20-minute didactic lecture given by an experienced IDD clinician, 5-minute case presentation by a participant, and 35 minutes of discussion about the lecture and case.
